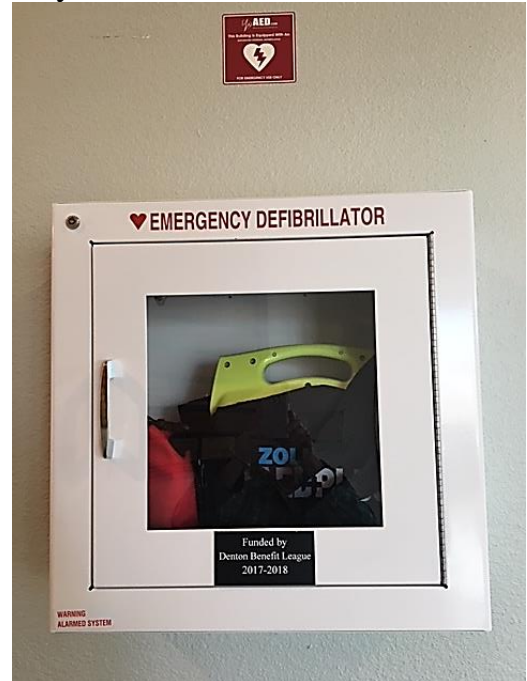

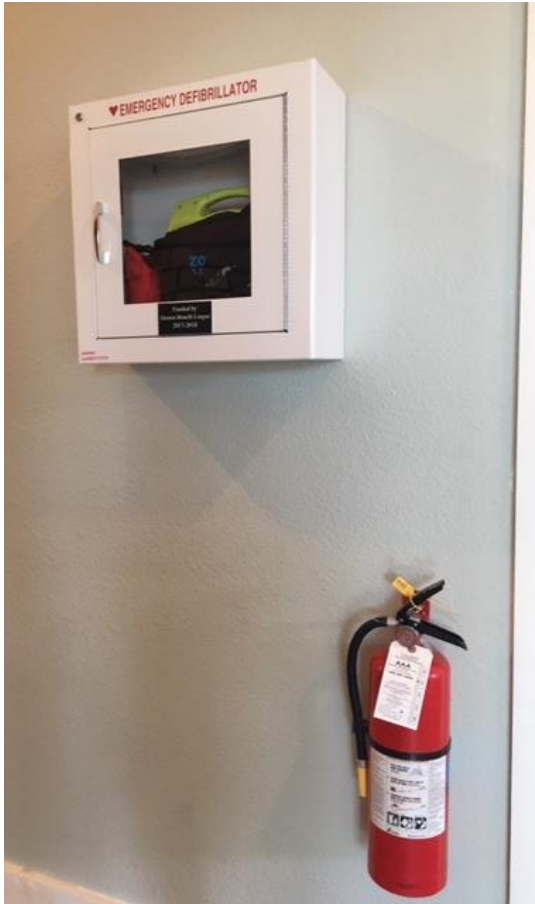

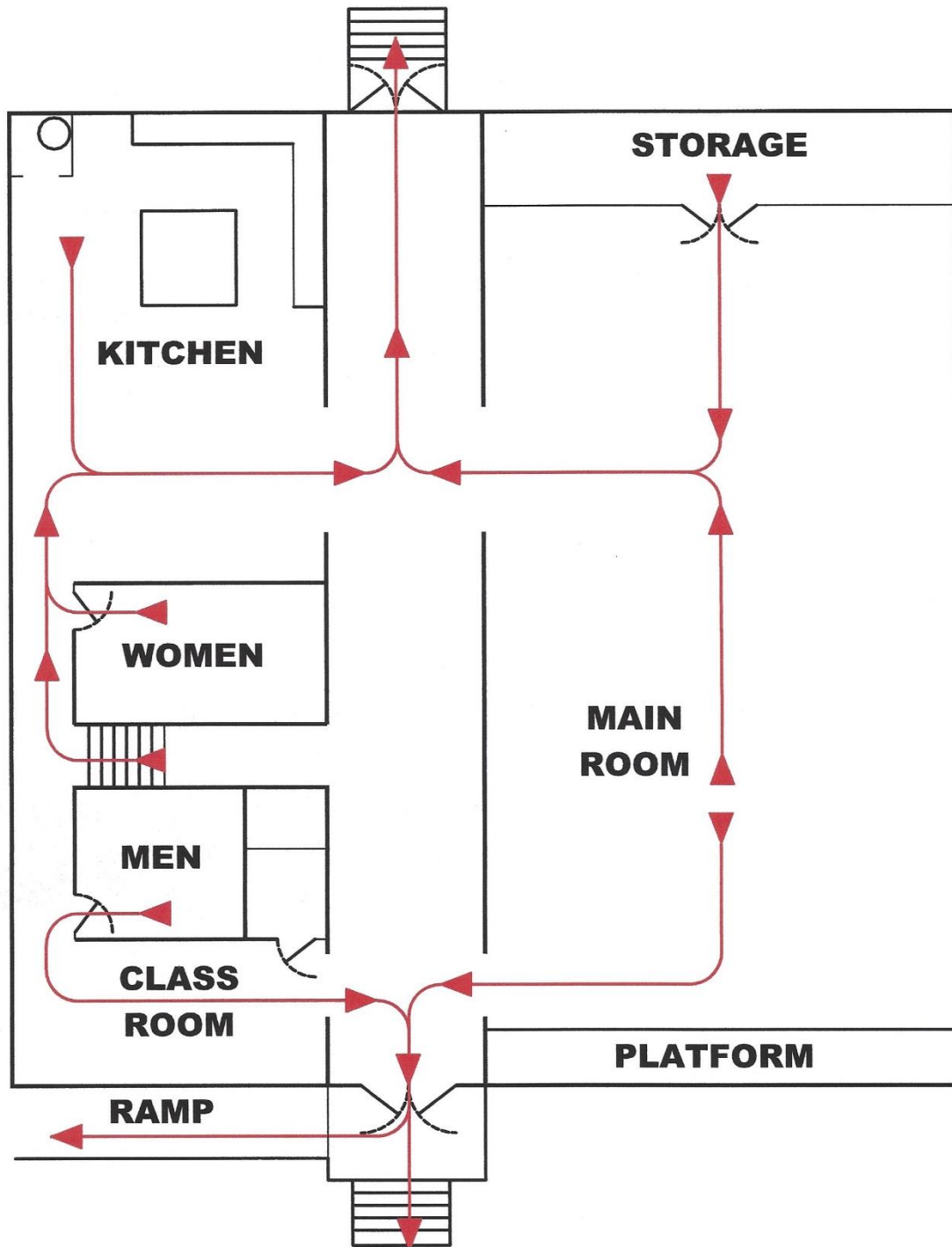

Note from the President.

One day last week, I received a call from our Support Services group while I was in the middle of writing an article for the National Veterans Magazine. The call was informing me that the Support Services Group had approved monetary support for a homeless Navy Korean Veteran. He was in need of a place to stay for four days until he could get permanent housing through the Catholic Charities. This was on a Thursday and it was for four nights at a motel in Lewisville. I was the only one available to go pay for the rooms. As I stopped what I was doing, I was a little put out that I had stop working on a very important project and drive to Lewisville and pay for living arrangements for a fellow Veteran.

As I got in my truck, the rain started to fall, it was cold and I knew I would be caught not only in the rain, but in the north bound traffic on my way home. On my way south bound toward Lewisville, dodging crazy drivers and that stupid beaver that was causing a lot of traffic problems, a different attitude came into my little brain. Here I was stuck in slow traffic, with rain falling and listen to the sound of horns expressing their displeasure of being on I35 as well. I was feeling sorry for myself for having to go take care of something that was part of my job.

By the time I got to the hotel, my attitude had changed. Here this Veteran didn't have a pot to whiz in and in need of a little help. I soon realized that I was blessed and didn't have to worry about my next meal or where I would be sleeping that night. Most of us have it pretty darn good.

Besides, my brothers and sisters in our Chapter spend many hours raising the funds and then give it back to those in need as charged in our mission. If they can raise the funds, then I should be honored to help our brothers and sisters in need. I never met the Veteran; but paid for the rooms as required.

As I drove off not looking forward to seeing that stupid beaver, a tremendous feeling of pride and satisfaction came over me, knowing that we were able to help another Veteran in need. My heart swelled up with happiness, especially how proud I felt when I saw that the receipt said: **“Paid in full by the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter #920.”** To all of you, thank you for what you do. We are making a difference.

Lastly, I'm reminded of a special charge in part of Abraham Lincoln's second inaugural speech when he said:

To care for him who shall have
Borne the battle,
And for his widow,
And his orphan...

This day we did...thank you 920.
